

## **REQUIRED TOOLS:**

Sacrificial clothes and shoes (they are going to get messy) Hearing protection Safety Glasses Dust Masks Work Gloves (like garden gloves) optional
2 pairs of pliers (1 plain old slip-joint pliers & 1 needle nose)
Wire Cutters (diagonal cutters aka "dykes") Utility knife with spare blades Flathead Screwdriver Scissors (the heavier and sharper the better) Putty Knife #2 pencils Ruler (6" and/or 12" are handy) Small saw (Japanese pull saws are great) Low-Angle Block Plane (Not essential, but very helpful) Shinto Rasp ( available at <a href="www.woodenboatstore.com">www.woodenboatstore.com</a> ) Qty 24 - 2" spring clamps (meaning they will open 2"). At minimum bring 24 36-40 is better. We will augment from the classroom inventory. Note that Home Depot, etc. usually have good ones for \$1/each.

This is the basic collection we will use during the class. This list supersedes the list found in the CLC manual for home builders as well as the one found on CLC's website. If there are two of you working together you will want 2 each of the pliers, wire cutters, putty knives, and utility knives. The shop has tools, as will your instructor, but having your own will keep you productive rather than waiting a turn. We will provide all the consumable items for the project, such as gloves, sandpaper, mixing cups, etc. We will spend a lot of class time talking about tools and materials you'll use to prep and paint your boats at home.
