This is the basic collection we will use during the class. **This list supersedes the list found in the CLC manual for home builders as well as the one found on CLC's website**. If there are two of you working together you will want 2 each of the pliers, wire cutters, putty knives and utility knives. The shop has tools, as will I, but having your own will keep you productive rather than waiting a turn. We will provide all the consumable items for the project, such as gloves, sandpaper, mixing cups, etc. We'll spend a lot of class time talking about tools and materials you'll use to prep and paint your boats at home.
