BRONZECASTING

Please remember that this is an introductory course with a purpose of teaching you the basics of bronze casting. In regards to class projects, Michael will be bringing many items suitable for casting by students. If you are interested in bringing a piece to work on in class, please keep in mind that it must be small in size and practical for an introductory class. For example: oarlocks, sockets, small cleats, fittings etc. would be appropriate. Portholes and anchors, etc. are not practical. If you are considering bring a piece to cast, please contact Michael prior to your arrival, for his approval.

MUST HAVE:

Leather Boots or Shoes Heavy Cotton Pants and long-sleeved shirt (or denim jacket) Cotton work hat e.g., welder's cap Welding Gloves Safety Glasses

GOOD TO HAVE:

Tools to make wood patterns include:

Small block plane

Misc. chisels & gouges

Cordless or plug-in drill w/selection of bits e.g., 1/16-3/8"

Sanding pad & misc. sandpaper Half-round rasp file, 8 or 10" long Rat-tail file, round 1/4 or 3/8" diameter

Rat-tail file, found 74 of 376 diameter

Wood rasp (best is 4-way woodworker's rasp)
