

WOOD-AND-CANVAS CANOE REPAIR

REQUIRED TOOLS:

Safety Glasses

Hearing Protection

Dust Mask

Work Gloves (for handling hot wood)

RECCOMMENDED TOOLS:

Utility knife with extra blades

Hammer –7 or 12 oz.

Back saw or Japanese saw (saws that cut on the pull stroke work better for canoe work)

Block plane

Finger Plane (Stanley 12-101 recommended)

Spokeshave

Chisels 1/4" & 1/2"

Sharpening stones (oil or water – your choice)

Assorted slotted and Philips head screwdrivers

Combination square

Tape measure

Adjustable bevel gauge

Tack puller

Hacksaw blades
